The 'Our World' topic is about ...

During this first topic the children will be building upon what they have already learnt about Ormskirk and their locality.

Through Geography and History lessons the children will be applying and developing their fieldwork skills.

The children will be taken on a tour of Ormskirk by a local historian where they will be given the opportunity to ask and answer questions and delve into the history of their local area as they look at the chronology of Ormskirk.

How to name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom local to them. They will identify human and physical characteristics, and land-use patterns; and understand how some of these aspects have changed over time.
