'Prophecy and Promise'

"Loving God In All We Do."

The 'Prophecy and Praise' topic is about ...

During this topic the children will know that the church teaches:through the words of the Holy Scripture how Jesus' birth was foretold and how representations in art around the world, connect to the prophecies of Christ's coming . They will build upon what they have already learnt about the history of Ormskirk and use this to learn about their locality. They will the explore how Ormskirk is located in the county of Lancashire and the geographical and human features of the surrounding

Prior learning

In Year 2, children were taught to:

-name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas

-identify key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather

-identify key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop

Our current learning

In Year 3, the children will be taught to:

-Name and locate counties, cities and geographical regions of the United Kingdom and recognise their identifying human and physical characteristics and why people settled there.

-Describe key aspects of human geography including: types of settlement and land use, economic activity including trade links.

-Become familiar with maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries.

-Use a range of methods including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.

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'Prophecy and Promise'

<u>R.E.</u>

This half term we shall talk about why Catholics go to Mass on Sunday and how they celebrate Mass. We shall explore some ways that Christians prepare for the coming of Christ during Advent. and how representations in art around the world, connect to the prophecies of Christ's coming.

Wider curriculum learning

Maths—we shall focus on developing strategies for multiplication and division.

Art and design- We shall learn about the artist Frida Kahlo focussing on drawing and shading skills and then moving on to making our own designs. This will lead into learning some new printing techniques.

The focus for Science will be Light. We shall learn about primary and secondary sources, how light travels compared to sound, how shadows are made and the dangers of too much light.

Our Geography learning will be centred around Ormskirk and its place in the world. The children will learn to sketch a detailed map.

In PSHE this half term we will continue our theme of Growing and Changing, and Keeping Safe.

In Computing the children will learn how to send an email and how to stay safe online.

Music – the children will learn about the features of a ballad and perform a ballad using actions.

French-the children will practise counting, adding and subtracting in French and using this to play games.

In PE, the children will apply basic tennis skills and also play competitive invasion games.

Comics- The Incredibles and Batman
