<u>'Animal Kingdom'</u>

"Loving God In All We Do."

The 'Animal Kingdom' theme is about ...

During this topic the children will be learning about rocks and being scientists. We'll look at famous scientists from the present era and further back in History.

Our focus will be studying scientists who have discovered interesting facts about the rock system. Using their rock knowledge children will learning more about the plate tectonic system which results in volcanoes and earthquakes.

What we already know...

- Pompeii was destroyed by a volcano and rocks.
- There are different types of rocks.
- Rocks are all around us outside and inside our homes.
- Mountains are rocks.

By the end of the theme we will know ...

Pupils will work scientifically by:

- We will able to group together different types of rocks based on their appearance and other physical properties.
- We'll describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped in rock.
- We'll recognise that rocks and soils can be different depending on the environment.
