In PSHE this half term, we will continue our theme of Health and Wellbeing: growing and changing, and keeping safe.


In Music, we are excited to draw upon our understanding of repeating patterns in music, to adapt and transpose a motif, making links to the Romans. KAPOW– Curriculum.
