The 'We are Creative' topic is about:

Creativity with a Greek theme running throughout, to link with our Greek Mythology lessons in English.

We will be exploring the use of clay to create Greek sculptures, and our taste buds will be put to the test in a lovely Greek food tasting afternoon, which will consist of mainly savoury dishes.

In Geography we will be mapping the islands surrounding the Greek mainland and naming the surrounding seas.

What we already know...

We have some prior knowledge of Greek Myths and legends. We know about Medusa, Pandora's Box and the mighty Minotaur.

Our English lessons this half-term will build on this prior knowledge and further develop our knowledge and understanding.

By the end of the topic we will know:

Whereabouts in Europe we can find Greece and the surrounding islands and seas. All about various Greek Myths and Legends and how to write one of our own based on a model. How to use modelling clay to create a sculpture and whether Greek food is something we enjoy as a class and would recommend to our families and friends.

Vocabulary

English:

Biography, Auto-biography, Ancient Greek Mythology, Poetry with figurative language.

Maths:

Place Value, Written Calculations, Traction, decimals and Percentages, Measuring Volume and Capacity, Area and Volume of Shapes.

Science: States of matter, reversible and irreversible changes, pattern seeking, identifying and classifying.

RE:

Freedom and Responsibility.

Computing:

Computer science, 3D modelling & printing, programming, code.

Art & DT:

Creating a clay sculpture with a Greek theme influenced by Andrew Goldsworthy.

Music:

Listen to and appraise classical music, improvise with instruments and embed interrelated dimensions of music.

PSHE:

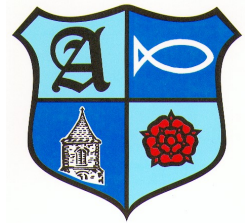
Living in the wider world.



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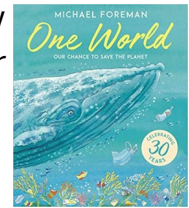


Wider curriculum learning

In our PSHE lessons we will be learning about, '**living in the wider world.**' These lessons cover objectives such as: appropriate use of social media platforms, appropriate use of images on texts and social media, different ways of keeping track of money and the risks associated with money. Also, possible future career choices.

We are going to read a range of mythical fiction texts from 'The Orchard Book of Greek Myths' by Geraldine McCauchran.

Also, 'One World' by Michael Foreman. A stunning story about how pollution affects our environment, which will present opportunities for discussions on recycling and sustainability.



In collaborative learning this half-term we are going to

Create sculptures outdoors influenced by Andrew Goldsworthy and make clay models with a Greek theme.

Let's try this at home

Go to the garden, park or beach and make sculptures with what you can recycle.

Do a plastic litter pick on Formby beach to help the environment.

Key dates for this half-term
