The 'Prophecy and Promise topic is about ...

...preparing ourselves as we approach the season of Advent and the coming of Jesus. Throughout the term we will have a particular emphasis on physical and mental well-being, exploring feelings and how we can keep our bodies fit.

In Design and Technology children will understand and apply the principles of a healthy and varied diet. They will choose ingredients to support healthy eating choices when designing their food products. Their learning journey will lead them to prepare and cook a variety of dishes, using a range of cooking techniques.

In Science pupils will recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function (in the long term and short term).

Wider curriculum learning


In **English** children will be studying war poetry in association with our Remembrance Day assembly. Later on in the term we will explore the features of explanation texts, aiming to write our own. **Maths** lessons this half term will aim to deepen children's understanding of fractions. In **Computing** pupils will learn about computing systems based on the work of Bletchley Park. Meanwhile in **French** children will continue to continue to develop their vocabulary and use this to help them begin to form longer sentences around the topic of 'In My House'. In **Music** children will begin to understand the history of music, looking at songs of WW2. In **PE** children will continue to work on their gymnastic skills and also be further developing their tactical awareness through invasion games such as netball.
