Year 6 Medium Term Plan 'We are Creative'



<u>RE</u>

Healing

Children will explore how we can care for others and how Jesus can

comfort the sick.

Common Good

Children will be able to show how their own and others' decisions to act justly and fairly/unjustly and unfairly are informed by beliefs and values.

<u>Maths</u>

Children will be revising topics studied throughout this year, including:

- Algebra
- Shape
- Mean
- Division (decimals)

Pupils will also complete two projects using the wide range of mathematical skills they have acquired throughout the year: 'Theme Park Maths' and 'Spirals'.

<u>English</u>

Wonder

Pupils will study the morals behind the story 'Wonder' and will explore a variety of writing opportunities in relation to both the novel and film.

Sea Poetry

Children will explore poems on the theme of the sea, looking at both performance poetry and also poetry writing.

Driver Subject — Art

Seaside Art

Pupils will explore the roles and purposes of artists, craftspeople and designers working in different times and cultures.

Children will use a range of media to create seaside themed art, including collage, paint and sculpture.

<u>Science</u>

Research

To link in with our topic on 'We are Eco Warriors', children will research how scientific ideas have developed over time and had an impact on our lives. They will recognise which secondary sources will be most useful to research their ideas and begin to separate opinion from fact.

Communicating

Pupils will make decisions about how to present and explain their findings through talk, in written forms or in other ways (e.g. using technology).

<u>Geography</u>

Human and Physical Geography

Children will continue to study contrasting localities. They will explain some links and interactions between people, places and the environment.

Geographical Skills

Pupils will communicate geographical information using a wide range of methods including writing at increasing length.

<u>Computing</u>

Quizzing

Children will create a picture based quiz for younger pupils.

Pupils will also use programs to help them explore question types and will work towards creating a quiz which requires the player to search a database.

<u>Music</u>

Children will know that time and place can influence the way music is created, performed and heard. They will make informed suggestions of suitable pieces of music for various occasions.

Pupils will continue to explore and compare a variety of sounds in a piece of music, identifying the prominent melodies.

Transition

PSHE

Children will learn about the new opportunities and responsibilities that increasing independence may bring.

Pupils will explore problem-solving strategies for dealing with emotions, challenges and change, including the transition to new schools.

Children will learn about diversity: what it means; the benefits of living in a diverse community; about valuing diversity within communities.

Languages— French

Children will pick out main details from a story, poem, song, conversation or passage.

Pupils will write phrases from memory and adapt these to make new sentences.

PE—Tracking and Fielding

Developing Skills

Children will continue to develop sport specific skills, applying them with control and precision.

Application of Skills

Children will apply a range of skills and tactics in a range of other games such as net / wall or striking / fielding type activities.

Collaborative Learning

Children will visit Rock and River as a year group, where they will work group on a number of exciting outdoor challenges. Pupils will also have the chance to work in groups this term on maths projects, which they will do within their year group bubble.
