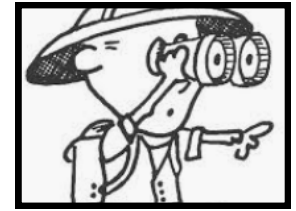


# St. Anne's Catholic Primary School

## Year 3 Medium Term Plan 'We Are Explorers.'



### RE

#### **Journeys**

The children will explore and learn about our Christian family's journey with Jesus through the Church's year.

#### **Listening and Sharing**

During this topic the children will be listening and sharing with one another as well as listening to the word of God and the importance of Holy Communion.

### Maths

#### **Place value, counting and mental addition and subtraction**

- Select a mental strategy appropriate for the numbers involved in the calculation

#### **Fractions**

- Recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators

#### **Written and Mental Division**

- Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that we know.

#### **Measurement (volume/ capacity and mass)**

- Measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm) and mass (kg/g);

#### **Multiplication using statistics, measurement and money**

- Continue to recognise and use the symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p)

### English

#### **Non Chronological Reports**

The children will work towards creating their own non chronological report based around the Romans after focusing on the book 'What the Romans did for us.'

#### **Diaries**

Children will be identifying the different features of a diary and will write their own entries using 'Rosie Revere, Engineer!'

### Driver Subject—History

#### **Romans**

The children will be learning all about the Roman Empire, its success and failures.

They will also study the Romans significant impact on Britain and the significant leadership of Boudica against the Roman invasion.

This will allow the children to discuss historical events issues connections and changes.

## Science

### STEM

**Scientific Enquiry**—Fair and comparative testing and Questioning will be done through the children's STEM work.

## Geography

### Fieldwork

This term the children will develop their Geographical skills and field work.

They will do this by observing, recording, and naming geographical features in their local environment of school and the wider community of Ormskirk.

## Art & Design

### Mosaics

Children will begin to understand the historical and cultural significance of a chosen art form. This term they will be creating their own Roman mosaic based on Roman life.

They will use a sketch book to collect and store their ideas to then adapt their work as they develop, and discuss this with those around them.

## Computing

### Digital Literacy—Online safety

Through computing children will understand the importance of reporting any concerns they have using the internet and other communication technologies, and know some ways in which they can do it.

They will develop an understanding of what is acceptable and unacceptable online behaviour.

Also realising that not all information on the internet is trustworthy and there is a need to verify its reliability.

### Design Technology

#### Shields

Through their shield creation they will plan more than one design or adaptation of an initial design.

They will select from materials according to their functional properties and then discuss how well the finished product meets the user's design criteria.

### Languages

#### French

Speak with increasing fluency and confidence.

Understand and respond to spoken language from a variety of resources.

The children will focus on celebrations and months of the year.

### PE

#### Target Games

Play competitive games, and apply the basic principles suitable for attacking and defending target games.

### Music

#### Play and Perform

The children will play and perform in solo and ensemble groups using a glockenspiel .

Using increased control and rhythmic accuracy, responding through gestures or movement to changes in the speed of the beat.

### Collaborative Learning

The children will enjoy a celebration of all things Roman during Roman Day which will take place on Monday 10th February.
