

Sports Premium Funding - April 2018 – April 2019

St Anne's will receive over the course of the financial year April 2018 to April 2019, £19,596.

Schools must use this funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport we offer. Schools should use the pupil premium to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that we already offer.
- Build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

There are five key indicators that schools should expect to see improvement across:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Office guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day of which 30 minutes should be in school.
2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increases confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Break down of funding from April 2018 through to September 2018.

7/12 of funding from September through to April = £11,416

£6,020	Autumn and spring term cost for West Lancs. Sporting Partnership
£2,370	Two additional adults to organise games on the playground and teach the children how to use the gym equipment during dinnertimes – spring term costs.
£180	Footballs for after school clubs.
£400	Waterproof tops for sporting competitions.

Over the course of the financial year 2018/2019 the shortfall of £274 will be met through the school's main budget.
