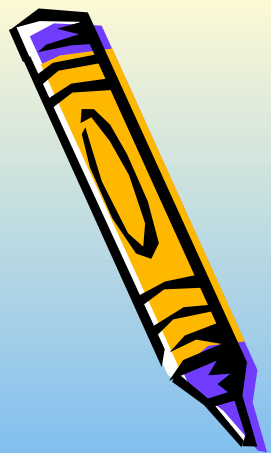

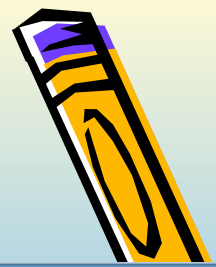

<p>The 'Our World' topic is about ...</p> <p>During this first topic the children will be building upon what they have already learnt about Ormskirk and their locality. 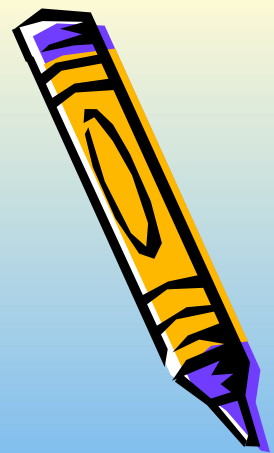


<p style="text-align: center;">RE</p> <p>Homes</p> <p>The children will explore the joys and sorrows of being a family at home. They will understand God's vision for every family and acquire the skills of assimilation, celebration and application of what they have learnt.</p> <p>Promises</p> <p>The children will explore belonging to a group involves promises and rules. They will learn about the meaning of the promises made at Baptism. <p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Number and place value</p> <p>Read and write numerals to 1000.</p> <p>Place value and mental calculation</p> <p>Find 1, 10 and 100 more or less than a given number.</p> <p>2D shape, length and mental calculation</p> <p>Draw 2D shapes.</p> <p>Statistics and Mental calculation</p> <p>Present and interpret data using bar charts.</p> <p>Written methods for Addition and Subtraction</p> <p>Add and subtract numbers up to three digits using formal written methods.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Driver Subject—Geography</p> <p>Locational and place knowledge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Name and locate a wider range of places in their locality, the UK and wider world. <p>Human and physical geography</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use geographical language to describe some aspects of human and physical features and patterns.• Make observations about places and features that change over time. <p>Fieldwork</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Ask and answer more searching geographical questions when investigating different places and environments.

- As the children move to Key Stage 2 we want to encourage more independence and encourage that children take more responsibility for themselves.

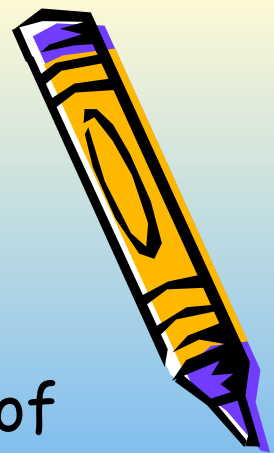


READING

- Teacher led Guided Reading once a week, using unseen fiction and non-fiction texts .
- Whilst other children are being heard read other activities will be being completed which are based around the class text.
- Children who finished Year 2 on white or above reading stage they are to choose their own books for school & home.
- There is no day for changing books.



Homework.



- The children will either receive one piece of English and Maths homework every Friday. (Occasionally it will be linked to another area of the curriculum.)
- These pieces of homework are due back by the latest the following Wednesday.
- Maths will be either in their homework book or online using MyMaths

Spellings will be given out on Friday to be returned on Friday, for a test but will be taught during spelling lessons during the week.

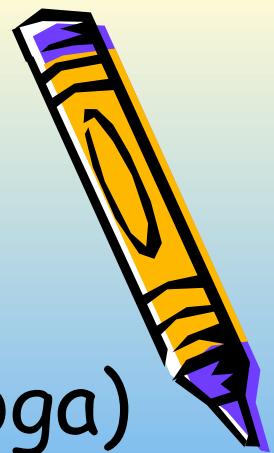
If you are a prospective parent or a parent of children in school, we hope you find our website a useful window to life at St Anne's. Visits to school are always welcome.
