# Phonics

- Daily Phonics Lessons – intensive, interactive sessions focussing on learning new sounds and applying in reading and writing.
- Based on the government documentation: Letters and Sounds
- We do set for phonics, this enables children to rapidly develop the knowledge and skills that they need for reading and writing.
- Children are assessed on a termly basis, and may change groups depending on their knowledge and skills of blending and segmenting.
- Year One Phonics Screening at the end of the year.

# Reading for Enjoyment

- In school, we encourage reading for pleasure and enjoyment through storytime and using quality texts throughout the curriculum.
- Supports children in developing vocabulary and imagination which helps to improve their writing.
- At home; library visits, storytime sessions and bedtime stories.

# Guided Reading

- The children will be learning how to read in small group sessions – guided reading.
- During the sessions the children will be taught reading skills; how to talk about a book, make predictions and comment on characters and plot.
- Reading books are fiction and non-fiction.
- The books are levelled so that the children can practise skills, but provided with a **challenge**.

# Home Reading

- Children will continue to receive a Home reading book. Two books will be sent home each week.
- Home readers are at a level below the Guided Reading level- this is to practise and consolidate what they have covered in phonics.
- Books will be changed once a week, usually on Fridays.
- Please sign and date the reading record book each time your child reads and add a comment if you wish. We shall try and respond to any of your questions.
- We will inform you of your child's progress at parents evening, but if your child needs extra help we will work closely with you to support their progress.



# St Anne's Reading Award

- Children are rewarded for their home reading throughout the year, but need your help to get their points, so please don't forget to sign their reading record book!
- When your child reads 20 books, they will receive a bronze certificate.
- When your child reads 40 books, they will receive a silver certificate and a St Anne's bookmark.
- When your child reads 60 books, they will receive a gold certificate and a reading book.
