Forest School

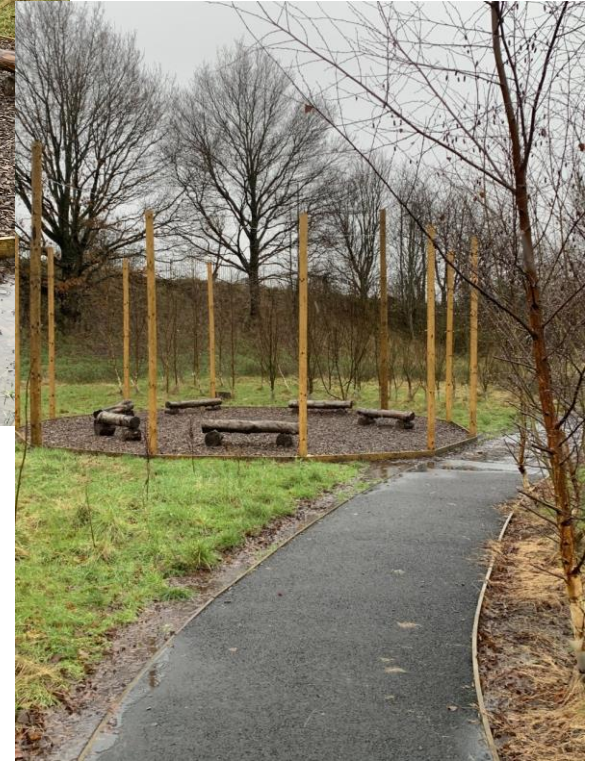


- Forest school is an outdoor learning experience in a natural environment.

Important! Health, Safety & Behaviour



Heath – We need to ensure we are wearing the correct clothing so that we can go out in all weathers and experience the outdoors.

Safety – Part of the Forest school experience is to learn how to be independent and learn lots of skills you wouldn't do in a normal classroom. So we'll have the opportunity to use tools and equipment that require us to use them in a safe way, like saws and knives. We can also experience outdoors cooking with open fires. As you know we will have to ALWAYS be safe around an open fires.

We will have an emergency procedure which I will show you when we get to go out on our first session.

Important! Health, Safety & Behaviour



Behaviour – Because we'll be using sharp tools and learning to make fires safely it is really important that when we go into our Forest school session we are ALWAYS listening and not doing anything that would put others in danger. If we are silly then the session will be stopped for safety reasons and we won't be able to continue.

- ▶ Not every session will involve tools and fire and we will have to get used to a few things before we do anything like that but there are lots of things we can do in the Forest school that will be interesting and enjoyable.

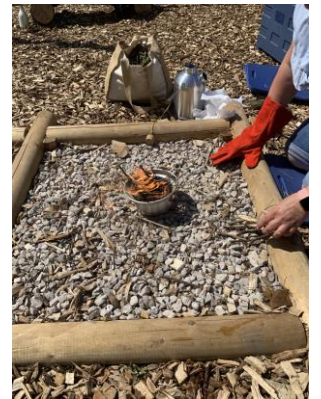


Rules



There are a few rules that **MUST** be adhered to whilst we are in Forest School.

- ▶ Always be ready to listen – We must get used to the call to stop what we are doing and gather back together. This will be **123 come to me!** You will gather in the seated area and be ready to listen. We will practice this a few times so that we know what to do.
- ▶ We must be aware of where we can explore and where we can't. Mrs Ballard will show you the boundary when we go outside.
- ▶ In the middle of the seated area there is a fire square. We must treat this fire square like it has fire in it all of the time. Therefore, we **NEVER** walk through it. We always walk around it. We never run about in the seated area in case of falls and therefore falling into the fire square.



Rules - Tools



- ▶ We will be using real tools so safety is extremely important
- ▶ You will need lots of support using these and only one person at a time can use them with adult supervision.
- ▶ We always set out a tool area and when not in use we keep tools safely packed/locked away.
- ▶ We make sure we have got the correct protective clothing on and we are in the correct position with our bodies for using them.
- ▶ When we choose tools to work with we must ALWAYS walk with them to the tool work area.
- ▶ When not in use in the tool work area we must make sure they are kept near us but not in the way.

- ▶ One of the first activities is looking for hazards and putting signs on them so we are all aware of them.
