God, the Ground of our Being

The dictionary definition of a parable is that it is a short simple story illustrating a moral or spiritual truth. Richard Rohr compares parables to Zen koans: they're meant to split apart our normal ways of thinking about things and help us see with different eyes and hear with different ears. 'We speak of getting lost in a story, but part of what draws us to a story is the promise of finding: finding a different world, finding another time, finding ourselves.' [1]

'The story of the sower and the seed is very familiar to us as are the various interpretations of the nature of the soil which symbolise the state of our heart. We have rightly been encouraged to lead lives which have all the ingredients of lives rooted in good 'soil': lives of love, of prayer, of forgiveness, of gentleness, of compassionate action.' [2] If we only consider this interpretation, we may only focus on what we do and especially on our many failures to be 'good soil.' We may be tempted to think that our weaknesses 'have the authority to name who we are. Only infinite generosity has the authority to name who we are.' [3]

'What if this parable is not about our own successes and failures but about the extravagance of a sower who does not seem to be fazed by such concerns, who flings seed everywhere, wastes it with holy abandon? If this is really the parable of the Sower and not the parable of the different kinds of ground, then it begins to sound quite new. The focus is not on us and our shortfalls but on the generosity of our maker, the prolific sower who does not obsess about the condition of the fields, who is not cautious or judgmental or even what we would call practical, who is not stingy with the seed but who casts it everywhere, on good soil and bad.' [4] This parable, like all the other parables, is meant to jolt us out of any understanding that would limit God's love to the good or the worthy. [2]

This interpretation of the parable focuses on God, the ground of our being. As we grow in awareness that 'the infinitely generous love of God is our origin, our sustaining ground' [3], as we become rooted in God's love, we will share that unconditional love with everyone we meet.

'When we pare away the layers of familiarity in the stories of our faith—those layers that can lull us into thinking we know what a story is about – we may find the story beneath the story; we may find where the story begins. When we reach for the threads that a good story offers, we are returned to ourselves.' [1]
