## *Love is the Answer*

There are several versions of the story of a man who prayed to God to be rescued from the rising levels of a flood. A rescue team in a rubber raft called to him, and he refused their offer of help, saying God would save him. When the power of the water was later crashing through the windows of his home, he sat on his roof. A helicopter came and he still refused help, saying yet again that God would save him. The flood did what floods do and he drowned. When he met God, he started complaining and accused God of not helping him. "I was so faithful and I waited for you. Why did you abandon me?" Perplexed, God replied, "I sent a raft and a helicopter. Did you not see them?" [Source: Mark Nepo, *The Book of Awakening*]

The above story illustrates one example of our understanding of prayer: we make our repeated requests for help but we have our own preconceived ideas about what that help should look like. Today's gospel could lead to another misconception of prayer: that our persistent requests could change God. Prayer is meant to be: 'an interior practice to change the one who is praying.' [1] St Augustine tells us that when we pray 'we are always holding our hearts open for whatever God always wants to give us.' When we pray consistently and with persistence 'our hearts are being enlarged to divine proportions. In those fleeting moments it is not that we intuit something more is being given to us, but we fleetingly glimpse the abyss-like nature of the love that every moment really is.' [2]

All three readings today emphasise persistence. 'It is strange that we have come to understand the importance of practice in sports, in any successful business and in any creative endeavour, but for some reason most of us do not see the need for it when we want to develop a personal relationship with God.' [1] How we 'practice' prayer is a very personal choice and throughout the course of our lives we may make several changes to the way in which we pray. 'Our task is to find the way which moves us to love and to give ourselves to it in love.' [2]

When we pray we are not negotiating a transaction. We surrender to transformation in ourselves and in whoever and whatever we bring to God in prayer. 'We do not wait for God. We wait with God.' [3] 'It is not that God answers our prayer, but that God is the answer [1] And since God is love, then love is the answer. Being rooted and grounded in love, we will then pray always and not lose heart.'
