Kingship

Each 'Nowadays, democracy, with all its complexities, is the preferred form of regulating society. We may have great respect for royalty but the position of kingship no longer demands the same obedience as it did in past years and from that point of view it is no longer a relatable image for our modern world. What then can we make of today's feast, celebrating Christ as our king?' [1] 'To guide our reflection the Gospel of John offers us a picture of Jesus at his physical and emotional worst: arrested, dishevelled, hungry, harassed, abandoned, sleep-deprived — and standing before Pontius Pilate for questioning. If I were going to write Jesus into a kingly scene, this would not be the one I'd write. This week, our king is an arrested, falsely accused criminal, a dead man walking. His chosen path to glory is humility, surrender, brokenness and loss.' [2]

And yet, standing before Pilate, Jesus says, "Yes, I am a king. I was born for this, I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth; and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice." 'This was in response to Pilate's question, "Are you the King of the Jews?" He really wants to know if Jesus is a threat to his identity, his power, his rule. "What have you done," he inquires. Behind that question lay his real concern. "Have you upset the status quo I seek to maintain?" Whether spoken or unspoken, conscious or unconscious, this concern gets triggered every time we encounter another person, a different idea or belief, a new decision or event that might affect us. Like Pilate we want to know what we have to do in order to defend our kingdom, our status quo. We do not want someone to mess with our self-identity, values, beliefs and opinions. And we certainly do not want them taking away our power, privilege, control or comfort.' [2]

Today's reading doesn't include Pilate's response to Jesus' affirmation that he came 'to bear witness to the truth.' Verse 38 continues with Pilate asking, "Truth? What is that?" – but he doesn't wait for an answer. 'He walks away from truth's most complete and complex embodiment: the truth is Jesus, the life of Jesus, the way of Jesus, the love of Jesus. In defending our kingdoms we tend to live as if the truth belongs to us. And in that moment we are no longer listening to the voice of Jesus, we are unable to hear the voice of Jesus in each other. But when we pray, 'Thy kingdom come,' we are choosing to not just live in a new kingdom but to be and become a new Kingdom, following a King whose very identity is truth, and whose best expression of power is surrender. 100 Years of the Diocese of Lancaster

On 22nd November 1924 Pope Pius XI created the Diocese of Lancaster to care for Catholics in Cumbria and North Lancashire. St Peter's in Lancaster was made a cathedral. We begin our year of celebrations and thanksgiving to God for our diocese on 24th November, the Feast of Christ the King. The Bishop will open the centenary year at the 10.30am Mass in the Cathedral. In the afternoon he will celebrate Vespers (evening prayer) and Benediction at 4pm. During Benediction we will sing the Church's great hymn to thanksgiving and praise, the 'Te Deum'
