Gates and Chasms

'The Bible is a record of people's experience of God's self-revelation, written by people trying to listen to God. We know that humans always see "through a glass darkly and all knowledge is imperfect" (1 Cor 13:12). More than telling us exactly what to see in the Scriptures, Jesus taught us how to see, what to emphasise and also what could be de-emphasised or ignored. Beyond fundamentalism or literalism, Jesus practised a form that the Jewish people called midrash, consistently using questions to keep spiritual meanings open, often reflecting on a text; or he would reply to people's questions with more questions. It is a real shame that we did not imitate Jesus in this approach. It could have saved us from so many centuries of righteousness and religious violence. Rather than seeking always certain and unchanging answers, the Jewish practice of midrash allows many possibilities, many levels of faith-filled meaning that is relevant and applicable to you, the reader, and puts you in the subject's shoes to build empathy, understanding, and relationship. It lets the passage first challenge you before it challenges anyone else. To use the text in a spiritual way—as Jesus did—is to allow it to convert you, to change you, to grow you up as you ask: What does this ask of me? How might this apply to my life, to my family, to my church, to my neighbourhood, to my country?' [1]

'At some point in our lives we have probably all been both the rich man and Lazarus. Today's gospel is asking us to acknowledge and deal with the gates and chasms that separate us from each other. The gate that becomes a chasm always exists within us before it exists between us. It is a condition of the human heart. Today we are being invited to examine our hearts to find the gates that separate us from ourselves, our neighbours, our enemies, those we love, and ultimately God: gates of fear, anger, greed, pride, prejudice, loneliness, sorrow, addiction, busyness, indifference, apathy, hurt, resentment, envy. Gates destroy relationships. But every time we see and treat one another as created in the image and likeness of God, gates are opened and chasms are filled. Christ's love, mercy, grace and presence make it possible for us to open our gates and ensure they do not become chasms. He is the image of our opened gates and our filled chasms, the image of who we most truly are and who we are to become.' [2]
