Experiencing the Mystery of the Trinity

'The deepest and most profound truths of our lives are not provable facts. They are those which offer experiences and meaning, not explanations and understanding.' [1] 'We have framed the teaching on the Trinity as a belief rather than as an experience.' [2] How can we experience the mystery of the Trinity? It may surprise us to discover that we have many fleeting experiences of the Trinity in our daily lives.

We experience God as Father, the invisible Source of all life, whenever we stop in wonder at the birth of a child; whenever our hearts rejoice to see the first signs of Spring; or whenever we 'give ourselves over to the beauty of the setting sun giving itself over to us.' [3]

We experience God as Jesus, as Christ, the Son of God, God-among-us; 'the one who makes visible this eternal invisibility.' [4] We do not experience Jesus in his humanity. We experience Christ as the Word. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made." (John 1:1-3) 'Christ is deeply embedded in all things – as all things. We live in a Christ-soaked universe.' [4]

'We experience God deeply within us as Holy Spirit when we experience a oneness with God and with each other, when we are energised to find ways to deepen and sustain that oneness. Our core, our deepest DNA, is divine; it is the Spirit of Love implanted within us by our Creator.' [4]

To choose to be baptised in the name of the Trinity, and to affirm that choice, is to respond to the invitation to live our lives growing in awareness of the reality of being one with God the Father, Source of all life; with Christ the Son of God, God among us; and with God within us as the Holy Spirit, deepening our awareness of our oneness with God and with each other. Here we have an understanding of the Trinity that moves out of abstract doctrine into intimate experience.' [2]

New Lectionary

There will be a new translation of the Lectionary in use from Advent this year. All parishes have to move from the Jerusalem Bible translation (with psalms from the Grail) to the English Standard Version: Catholic Edition (ESV-CE) of the Bible and the Abbey Psalter.

Just to be clear, the liturgical books in use in Church are the *Missal*, which contains the prayers for every Mass, and the *Lectionary*, which contains the Scripture Readings. If you have your own Missal this will contain both the prayers and the Scripture Readings but these Readings will no longer be the ones in use after the first Sunday of Advent. There will be new Missals available and we are hoping there might be a discount for buying these in quantity but no news on that yet. We are not sure if we will still be able to print the Readings on the back of the Newsletter as we do currently. We need copyright permission. We believe the new translation of the Readings will be available on the *Universalis* app for use on phones and tablets.
