'What goes around comes around.'

'In the gospel passage, Jesus summarises not only the cost of discipleship but also its rewards. The conditions of discipleship outlined may appear harsh yet they underline for us a truth: choosing anything with one's whole heart has consequences. Choosing life with Christ means that every relationship we have must be understood from the perspective of love. For many in Matthew's community, this choice brought division in their families.' [1] 'This is a gospel of scattered sayings that are found in Mark, Luke and John. The passage is a collection of good one-liners whose focus is not on those who suffer the most, but on those who love the most. And Jesus tells us that how we give out is how we receive. We might say, 'What goes around comes around.' [2].

The gospel highlights the importance of hospitality in living a Christ-centred life and this is also beautifully illustrated in the first reading. 'Looking for no reward, a Shunammite woman provided a sacred space for a holy man and within the space of her own self, an unexpected child began to grow. It's a strange economy, this kind of hospitality. We can't know what we will set in motion when we offer some space to the ones whom Jesus tells us to welcome. We offer a cup of cold water, or a place to rest, or an extra room, or a corner of our heart, not always knowing that each person comes with a word from God. And all of a sudden, we're carrying something we never expected to carry. Maybe it's not a literal child, as it was for the Shunammite woman. But this kind of hospitality always makes room for new life to take root in us and to come through us in ways that we can't predict. That's part of the strange economy, the curious ecosystem of hospitality: open a space to the holy stranger and God creates a sacred space within our own selves; an extra room in our own souls; a place for God to grow.' At times we are the stranger receiving the mutual life-giving welcome of hospitality. We give and receive 'with respect and reverence that the unknown between us might flower into discovery and lead us beyond the familiar field blind with the weed of weariness and the old walls of habit.' [4]
