Where there is no love, put love and you will find love

'Love is our origin. Love is our constant calling. Love is our destiny. God created us out of love, calls us to be mirrors of his love in the world and reach our goal of living in love in his presence for ever. Love has the power to effect change. God's love which is faithful and unconditional sets a very high ideal for us in every aspect of our lives. However, God's love is a forgiving and healing love when we find it difficult to live up to those ideals.' [1]

We do not find that compassionate approach in the Pharisees. 'Their question is not a pastoral question. It is a legal question. They are not worried about the spiritual or emotional well-being of a couple. In fact, as on other occasions, their main objective is to find a way to destroy Jesus.' [2]

'In his responses to the Pharisees and to his disciples, Jesus, in his vision for marriage, sets out a high ideal: God's ideal, that was there from the beginning. We are well aware that there can be a gap between what we are and what we want to be, between the reality and the ideal.' [2] Whatever decisions we make, 'somehow love has to be preserved if wounds are to be healed. Love is something we learn. Love is something we live. Love grows as it is 'forged' by the concrete situations in which we find ourselves. Love is born and constantly develops amid lights and shadows. Love can flourish when we try not to make conflict the last word, but rather a new opportunity: an opportunity to seek help, an opportunity to question how we need to improve, an opportunity to discover the God who is with us and never abandons us.' [3]
