The Curriculum Structure	<p>Creation and covenant: 'The heavens are telling the glory of God' (Ps 19:1).</p> <p>In this branch, pupils will encounter the God who creates and calls all people. They will explore revelation of the Christian belief that all that is comes from God; the Creation accounts in Genesis; and scientific explanations of the process of Creation. They will explore the call of God and his covenantal relationship with his people first through Abraham and Moses; then through the narrative of the Old Testament.</p>	<p>Prophecy and promise: 'In many and various ways, God spoke to our ancestors by the prophets' (Heb 1:1). The prophets speak of God reaching to his people, calling them back into a relationship with him.</p> <p>In this branch, pupils will explore the Christian understanding of the teaching of the prophets as they point to the fulfilment of God's promise in a messiah, Jesus Christ. They will explore the expectant waiting for the Messiah through the Advent season and how this speaks to Christians today as they wait for Christ.
