

St Anthony's Girls' Catholic Academy

Careers: Access arrangements

This policy statement sets out the academy's arrangements for managing the access of providers to give information to students about education or training with regard to technical education or apprenticeships. This complies with the academy's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997, as amended by the Technical and Further Education Act 2017, and specified in the Provider Access Legislation 2023.

Students in years 7-13 are entitled to:

- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point:
 - **Key Stage 3:** Have **two encounters** with approved providers of apprenticeships and technical education that is **mandatory** for pupils to attend.
 - **Key Stage 4:** Have **two encounters** with approved providers of apprenticeships and technical education that is **mandatory** for pupils to attend.
 - **Key Stage 5:** Have **two encounters** with approved providers of apprenticeships and technical education that is mandatory to put on, but **optional** for pupils to attend.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
