STAFFING UPDATES

SCHOOL BUILDING UPDATE

Phases 2 and 3 of the window project have been completed. This means we have smart, safe and more energy efficient windows and doors throughout the school. School would like to thank the Directors of Bishop Hogarth Education Trust for prioritising this work. We will need to provide 10% of the project costs. The main entrance door now has a security lock. Visitors will need to use the intercom to the left of the door to communicate with the office.







The entire school has been deep cleaned by NTH Solutions (An NHS Company) who were impressed at how clean our school was, even before they carried out their work. A deep Clean will take place each term.

Since March, School has also been thoroughly cleaned twice by our own staff on top of the daily cleaning in term time and the additional cleaning of surfaces on a daily basis. Additional cleaning will continue when school reopens.

Other safety measures that will be in place at the start of the school year

- ✓ Markings have been placed both inside and outside of school for social distancing and safe movement around school.
- ✓ Toilets are allocated to different bubbles. Groups do not mix and children can only go into the toilets one a time
- ✓ Children will remain in their class bubble, moving to Key Stage Bubbles for breaks, with the same adult/adults each day.
- ✓ At Breakfast Club and After-School Club children will be in their Key Stage Bubbles.
- ✓ At the end of the day, children will leave different entrances in their family bubbles/year group bubbles.
- ✓ We have lots of hand washing equipment around the school for children to access across the day. Every bubble has access to hot water for handwashing and to sanitising gel/liquid
 - ✓ Equipment including stationary will be provided for each child and stays with them.









Please help us by explaining to your child that the adults in school will be keeping their distance from the children and each other. Most of our children are very affectionate and we have all had to learn to use a thumbs up/ a wave/a smile to replace cuddles!

During the summer term, we found that children were great at social distancing. Adults find it more difficult, particularly at the school gates! Please move away from school as soon as you drop off/pick up your child/children.



ILLNESS

- If a child is hurt or unwell during the school day, we have PPE equipment to ensure that first aid can be safely administered.
- If we have a child or adult with symptoms of COVID 19 we will send that child home immediately and inform other bubble members if a positive test result is received. If the test is positive for COVID 19 everyone in the safety bubble and their families will need to self-isolate for 14 days at home. We will always get expert advice before taking any action and we will pass on that advice to you.

IF YOUR CHILD IS ILL OR YOU HAVE COVID SYMPTOMS YOURSELF, DO NOT SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL.

- Make sure that we can always contact you immediately if your child becomes unwell.
- You must tell us if your child or anyone in your family is displaying symptoms
 of Covid 19. Your child will need to have a test and we will need to see the test
 result before he/she can return to school.



Travelling To and From School

- Please try to walk or cycle to and from school wherever possible.
- If you must travel by car:
 please try to park a little further away from school
 and then 'Park and Stride'
 Please observe traffic signs and parking
 restrictions.

No parking anywhere on the school grounds without a registered disability badge.

Badge holders may use either of the disability parking bays or the lower visitors car park, close to the main gates. Please do not use other spaces in the staff car park.

Do not stop on the yellow zig-zag lines or try to use the gate area as a turning circle.

Please do not stop in the middle of the road to let children out of a vehicle.

- If you have to use public transport to get to school please make sure that you have set off early enough to arrive at school at the right time. Don't forget your masks!
- Year 6 pupils are encouraged, with parent/carer permission to walk independently to and from school.


PICKING UP AT THE END OF THE SCHOOL DAY

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Either school summer dress

or plain white polo shirt (or T shirt) + grey trousers/shorts/skirts/pinafores

Dark green sweatshirt/jumper/cardigan

Children may wear trainers to school as they will not be getting changed for physical activity. This will be reviewed as safety measures change.

X No jewellery apart from watches

X No earrings

X No nail varnish

X No extreme haircuts – including tramlines!

Long hair should be tied back for practical and hygiene reasons.

X No bags to be brought to school apart from disposable lunch bags.

Every child should have a waterproof coat with them every day.

Children may bring their own water bottle to and from school every day.

School Meals

Attached are the updated menus for September. Children will be able to choose from a hot or cold option each day.

The kitchen will still be able to cater for any specific dietary requirements based on medical needs.

Children can still bring a packed lunch from home but this must be entirely disposable –

No lunch boxes or lunch bags. Lunches from home are still expected to be healthy and balanced – no chocolate bars and no fizzy drinks!

The easiest, safest option is for your child to have a school lunch or a school packed lunch. (Free for Reception and KS1 pupils)
Key Stage 2 pupils may bring a piece of fruit for morning break

Other things to remember

• No visitors to school. Communication via telephone/email/MyEd.

Class Dojos is for sharing class work, homework information and highlighting good work and behaviour. Absence, appointments and all other queries should be made through the school office.

- The office will only be taking cash for after-school activities and Reception Class Milk money. No other cash should be sent into school. A new SCOPAY letter will be sent out during the first week of term.
- Please follow social distancing at all times we will refuse entry to anyone who we believe is not following protective measures out of school.
- Talk to your child about handwashing and social distancing where possible
- Contact school with any queries. There are bound to be things we have forgotten!
- Please remember that whilst we managed well with smaller numbers, reopening safely for all pupils is a huge challenge. We continue to try our very best and will be relying on the support and understanding of parents.
- We have conducted a rigorous risk assessment to ensure we are all as safe as possible. The measures outlined in this letter are an essential part of that risk assessment to keep us all safe.
- You can see from the messages on the website that the staff are really looking forward to seeing the children and welcoming them back to school.
