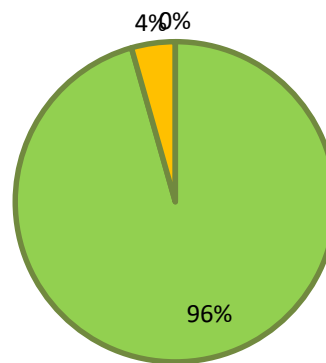
Overall – selected joint questions

Blossom: more animals, water slide (fast one), swimming pools, more maths, motorbikes, more sand pits, baby chicks, balancing stuff.

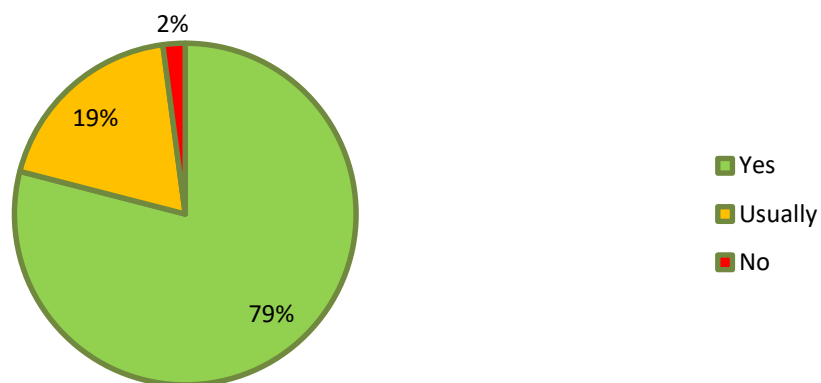

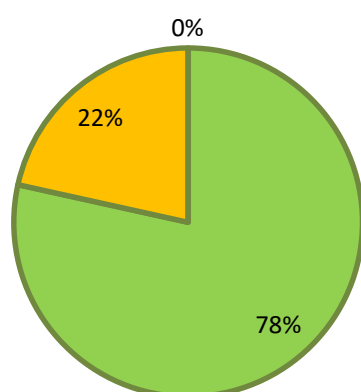
Beech: more books, more teachers?, trips, visitors in, Golden Time, swimming, make it bigger, benches

Biggest reason for negative response in question 15 was Y3 wanting the break time back together as a whole Key Stage.

What do you like about the school?

Year 3: playing on the Trim Trail, art, science, the staff in school, PE, playing with friends, singing, learning lots of new things, the teachers teach us interesting facts, the clubs we do, everyone is loving and kind, computing, English, German, maths, baking, theme days

Year 3/4: learning is about right, RE, we change topics regularly, my teachers, experiments in science, PE – fun, vocabulary sheets in science, learning lots of new skills, fun days, wet play games, clubs, treats like ice creams and parties, playing with friends

Year 4/5: I like how all the staff are trained medically, how much we learn, break and lunch times, the equipment, subjects – how everything is organised, seeing my friends, making new friends, after school clubs, the library, teachers are nice, working with different people

Year 5/6: break time – playing football, lunch time – playing with friends, like to learn – especially English/ maths, food at lunchtimes, listening to stories (especially Goodnight Mr Tom), free time, all the different lessons

Year 6: separate breaktimes for upper/lower Key Stage, Not too much homework, extra breaks for treats, Y6 assemblies, the Y6 teachers, the guinea pigs

What clubs do they like?

Year 3: bat and ball, competitive sports, One World Club, outdoor games, Futsal/football

Year 3/4: multi-sports, One World Club, Futsal, competitive sports, football

Year 4/5: athletics, football, bat and ball, multi-sports, choir, netball, One World Club, dodgeball

Year 5/6: dodgeball, netball, bat & ball, piano club, One World Club, football, choir, Mecanno Club, athletics, lunchtime club

Year 6: football, cooking, dodgeball

What clubs would you like to be able to do?

Year 3: basketball, gymnastics, tennis, work out, computing, dance, cooking, dodgeball, art/drawing, handball, choir, homework, music – playing instruments, netball, meditation

Year 3/4: baking, karate, arts and crafts, exercise, gaming, dance, dodgeball, basketball, tennis, knitting, gymnastics

Year 4/5: basketball, Lego, bike club, cooking/baking, tennis, art/crafts, reading/book club, homework club, fencing, sewing, language club, maths, computing

Year 5/6: cooking, knitting, baking, rounders, craft, cricket

Year 6: badminton, tennis, rounders/cricket, basketball

What activities would they like to see on the playground at break/dinner times?

Year 3: tennis (nets, bats & balls), football, hockey, basketball, netball, yoga, golf, dodgeball, stilts, skipping ropes, music, cricket, rugby, Lego, sandpit, bats and balls

Year 3/4: slide/swings, dodgeball, gardening, golf, friendship area/bench, trampoline, archery, party/ big group games

Year 4/5: swings, hop scotch, colouring, basketball, slide, grass area on KS2 playground, climbing frame – bigger and better, tic tac toe, daily activities like what Mr Whittle does with Y3 and Y3/4

Year 5/6: volleyball, tennis

Year 6: swings, slides, swimming pool, trampoline, rabbits, bikes, caged football pitch

What else would you like to improve about school?

Year 3: swings, slide, sandpit, running track, trampoline, spinning egg cup, circle spinner, treadmill, climbing trees, tree house

Year 3/4: entrance halls decoration, bigger classrooms, bigger playground, lockers, eating outside more, more dinner options, more nature, signs to guide you if you are new, bathroom updated, Infants and Juniors playing together

Year 4/5: pancakes/waffles etc for breakfast – can pay for them, each child to have a diary/jotter

Year 5/6: repair the trim trail, swings, slide, seesaw, swimming club, harder lessons

Year 6: trim trail, bigger football nets, grass, use of the Infant playground, nice wall!
