School Meal Price Increase from April 2025



We have been notified that the Local Authority have increased their school meal charges to schools as of 1st April 2025. Please note that the cost of a school meal has increased to £2.90 per school meal each day from 1st April 2025.

If you would like your child to continue having a school meal this will be chargeable at £2.90 per day (payable via Arbor App). For children who are registered for Free School Meals there will be no charge.

John 8:1-11

Summary: At the temple, Jesus encountered a woman accused of adultery, brought by scribes and Pharisees seeking to trap him. He responded wisely, suggesting only a sinless person should cast the first stone. This led her accusers to depart, and Jesus, left alone with the woman, chose not to condemn her, advising her to abandon her sinful life.

Gospel Acclamation: Even now, says the Lord, return to me with your whole heart; for I am gracious and merciful. (Joel 2:12-13)

Jesus went to the Mount of Olives. But early in the morning he arrived again in the temple area, and all the people started coming to him, and he sat down and taught them.

Then the scribes and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in adultery and made her stand in the middle. They said to him, “Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So, what do you say?”

They said this to test him, so that they could have some charge to bring against him.

Jesus bent down and began to write on the ground with his finger.

But when they continued asking him, he straightened up and said to them, “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.”

Again, he bent down and wrote on the ground. And in response, they went away one by one, beginning with the elders. So, he was left alone with the woman before him.

Then Jesus straightened up and said to her, “Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?”

She replied, “No one, sir.”

Then Jesus said, “Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore.”
