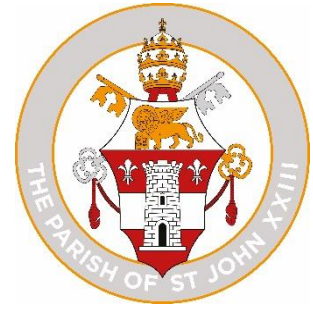

STEM Workshops

As part of our Science Curriculum, on Tuesday, 4th May 2021, our Year 5/6 and Year 6 pupils will be involved in an interactive workshop aimed at inspiring young people to engage with Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths.

This workshop is about exploring the world of fossils and the children will learn about Mary Anning, a palaeontologist who discovered fossils in Lyme Regis. They will be involved in practical activities including finding of fossils in sand, creating large skeleton jigsaws and handling fossils.
