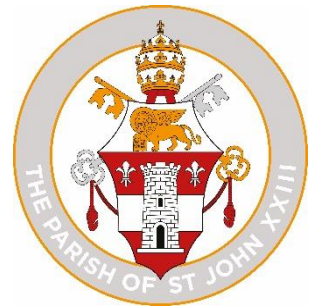

#### School meals

Please see Dojo for our meal menus for next week. If your child would like to have an 'ad hoc' meal all they need to do is let their Teacher know on the day – no pre-ordering is required.

**Please note that the cost of a school meal is increasing to £2.35 per day from September**

Children moving into Year 3 in September 2021 will no longer be eligible for Universal Free School Meals. If you would like your child to continue having a school meal this will be chargeable at £2.35 per day (payable via ParentPay). For children who are registered for Free School Meals there will be no charge.

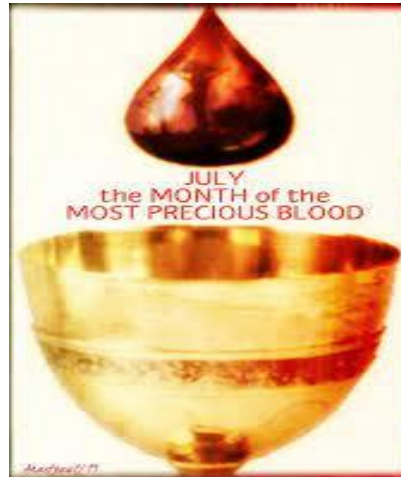
