### Key Learning Reading

- Use suffixes to understand meanings e.g. -ant, -ance, -ancy, -ent, -ence, -ency

### Key Learning; Cold Case

• Throughout iTech Level 3 iCSI pupils will learn how technology is used within the police, cyber units and other specialist departments to help them solve crimes. Pupils will understand the collaboration within technological departments is key. Pupils will understand how Cookies are used, what an IP address is, GPS tracking, click bait, phishing emails/pop ups and facial recognition software. With strong ties to the Teaching online safety in schools (Jan 2023) non-statutory guidance, pupils will leave this course with a strong understanding of how what they do online can directly affect them and their digital safety.

### **Music**

#### Key Learning: Singing

- Pupils will learn how to sing in a group setting, and briefly touch on 3-part harmony throughout the practice of singing complex rounds, and later in the course looking at 3-part choral harmony. Pupils will learn in depth about the anatomical factors of singing and understand how to apply these techniques to improve and aid their own singing.
- Pupils will understand how to better use their own voices through the understanding and application of anatomical factors. Pupils will experience the joys of singing in 3-part harmony with others and understand how harmonies are created and the health benefits of singing with others. Pupils will know how to use dynamics in order to add tension and interest to their singing.
- Additional lesson plans are in place for children with higher and lower ability, as well as lessons for a longer half-term.

### Extra Music Activities: Clarinets

• This is a 33 week programme, including a Performance Week at the end of each term. The Music Specialist will work to deliver these sessions. The children will learn how to play the clarinet.

   Pupils will practise conjugating familiar verbs in the present tense in order to describe themselves, someone they are talking to, and someone they are talking about. Pupils will practise what they learn in this unit through writing tasks and a big, active game.
- They will describe their friends, give reasons for why they like their friends and play riddle and interview games to practise what they have learnt.

### **Reminders and Homework**

Homework in Year 5 will consist of reading at least three times per week at home, practising times tables on TT Rockstars and learning spellings. Please can all parents/carers ensure that the school reading records are signed, dated and page numbers added, so that when following up in class, we know where the children are up to. If your child hasn't had time to read at home we will allocate a time for them to read in school. We aim to check records 2-3 times a week to ensure consistency.

Home reading books will be changed on Monday, but please note that the children can request to change their book if they have finished the one they currently have.

Spellings will continue to be given out on a Monday (displayed on dojo every week). These can be revised at home, alongside the input in class that we do every day to ensure understanding of spelling patterns etc. Spelling quiz will be on Friday.

#### Our PE days for this half term will stay the same- Monday and Friday..

All children should come to school in full P.E Kit on these days. Children should wear their normal house-coloured P.E. T-Shirt with black joggers or black/navy shorts.
