A typical day in Year 1 (for the first term).

- 8.45- Handwriting
- **9.00-** Register and morning task
- **9.15-** Worship
- **9.45-** Maths (There will be a whole class teach and then myself and Mrs Hegarty will take a group of approx 8 children each to complete their maths task whilst the other children are in the areas completing challenges).
- 10.45- 11.00-Break time
- 11.00-English (There will be a whole class teach and then myself and Mrs Hegarty will take a group of approx 8 children each to complete their English task whilst the other children are in the areas completing challenges).
- **11.45-** Phonics
- 12.15-Dinner Time
- 1.15- Register and maths (arithmetic) or handwriting.
- 1.30- Session 1 (e.g. Art, Science, Geography, History, PE etc..)
- 2.20- Session 2 (e.g. Art, Science, Geography, History, PE etc..)
- **3.10/3.15-** Story and prayer.
- **3.20-3.25-** End of school day.

Depending on the subject/s in the afternoon, half of the class may be completing challenges in the areas whilst the other half of the class are in groups completing subject specific work and then the children will swap over.






Brilliant Behaviour Recognition Board



We expect all children to start the day on ready to learn by being on time, being in the correct uniform and following our 4 B's.



Children who consistently follow our 4 B's, work hard and shine from the inside out by showing our Christian values will move into 'Time to shine' and will earn a values point. Values points winners will be awarded on Fridays in celebration worship. Parents will be informed on Wednesdays.



Children who choose not to follow our 4 B's will be given two warnings. If they continue to not follow the rules or are involved in a serious incident, they will complete a 'time to think' pink reflection sheet in their break or lunch time. Once they have reflected on their behaviour they will move back into 'Be ready'. Parents may be informed if it is a significant incident or we see a pattern of behaviour.

Golden Time

For the last session on a Friday, we have golden time in class. This is a time when children are allowed to use all of the areas freely. For instance, they are allowed to build something of their choice with the lego, magnets and straws or make and colour something of their choice in the creative area.

In order to get their golden time, children need to have completed 5 challenges that week. The children complete these challenges when they are not in teacher-led groups. The challenges will either consolidate learning e.g. from a phonics, maths, art or RE lesson the week or even day before or link to our topic. If they have not completed 5 challenges they have not completed 5 challenges (and they have been in school everyday) they will need to complete them in their golden time. For example, if they have completed 3 challenges, they will need to complete the other 2 in their golden time before they get to use their golden time to go and choose freely.



Phonics

All children in Year 1 were taught the Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonics sounds in Reception (please see them below). They are also on your child's portfolio. We start Year 1 by recapping the Phase 3 sounds.









In Year 1, we will start the year recapping the phase 3 sounds again. We will then move on to phase 4. Phase 4 does not have any new sounds but instead focuses on learning to read words with consonant blends. After that, we will work through Phase 5. Phase 5 is a long phase as there are lots of alternative sounds to learn (see below).




Homework








Children will have the opportunity to change reading books twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays when we will also check if they have read. Reading books will only be changed if it is recorded that they have read in their reading record. Library books will be changed on a Wednesday only.





All children will have the Year 1 tricky words stuck into their reading records for them to learn. They must be able to read and spell these words before they leave Year One.

We will monitor their progress half-termly.








By the end of Year One, children are expected to recall their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
