On average, every person in the UK throws away their own body weight in rubbish every 7 weeks. That's a lot of rubbish!

Of the 26 million tonnes of waste the UK produces, 12 million tonnes is recycled and reused. The rest is sent to landfill sites.

Recycling transforms things:

25 plastic bottles can be recycled to make one new fleece jacket.

Recycling transforms things. It's all about making something old into something new so that you can enjoy them again and again.

Making things from raw materials uses scarce natural resources. For example to make an aluminium can, someone has got to:

dig up raw materials (which can damage natural habitats),

Transport the raw materials to factories (often 1000s of miles away),

Process the raw materials to make aluminium products, like cans,

Distribute the product to retailers.

This process uses energy and creates emissions
