Elizabeth Alexandra Mary was born on April 21<sup>st</sup> 1926 and became queen on February 6<sup>th</sup> 1952.

On 20<sup>th</sup> November 1947 the then Princess Elizabeth married Prince Philip of Greece and Denmark, who was given the title Duke of Edinburgh.

At her coronation she became the head of the Church of England, and she often spoke about the importance of her faith.
