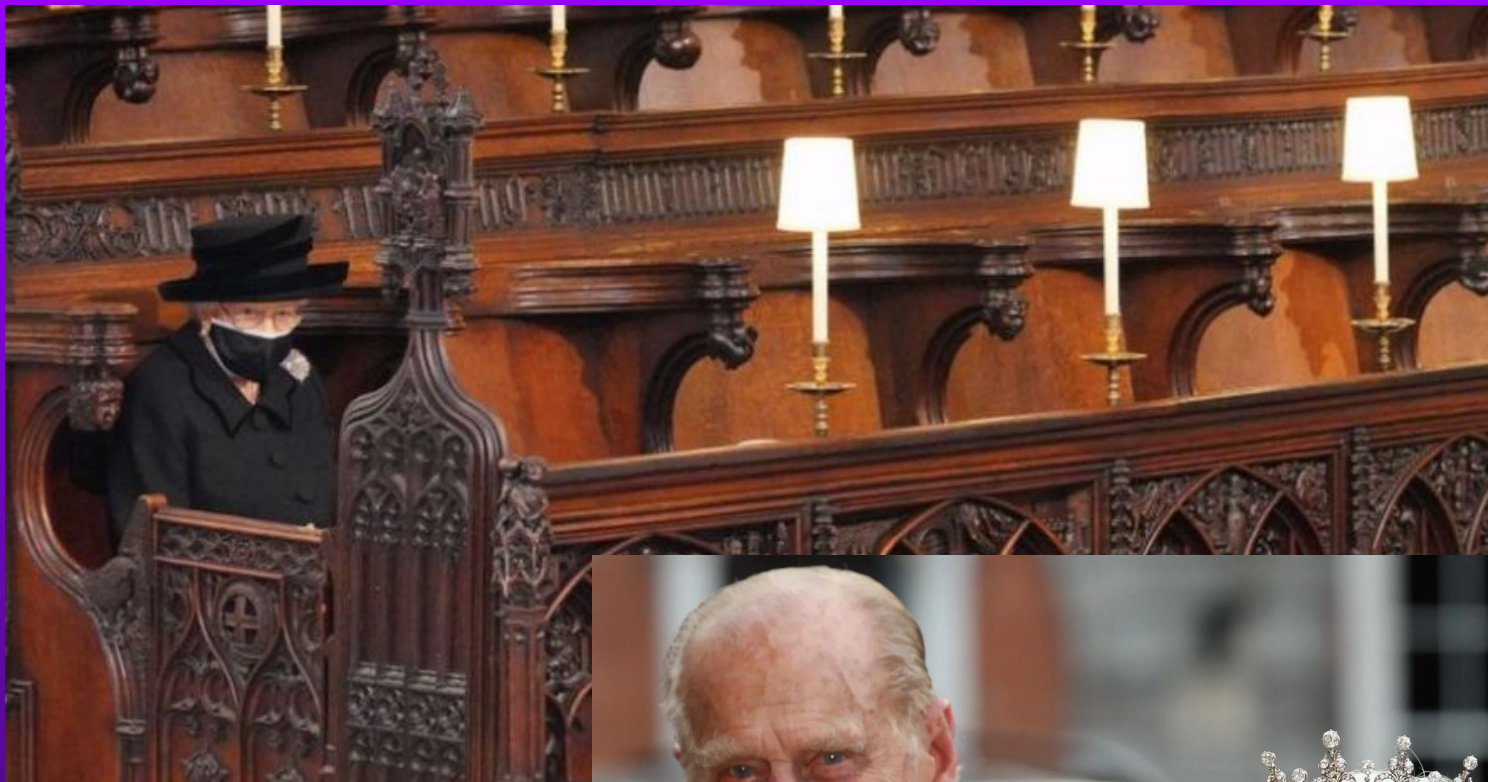

Events and street parties were enjoyed throughout the country and commonwealth.



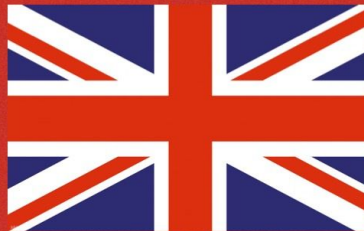

Queen Elizabeth II led an extraordinary life of service to Great Britain and the countries of the commonwealth.

Age 21 she made this promise

"I declare before you all that my whole life whether it be long or short shall be devoted to your service."



Elizabeth Alexandra Mary was born on April 21st 1926 and became queen on February 6th 1952.

Here she is with her father, King George VI, mother, Queen Elizabeth, and younger sister Margaret.



On 20th November 1947 the then Princess Elizabeth married Prince Philip of Greece and Denmark, who was given the title Duke of Edinburgh.



Queen Elizabeth and Prince Philip had 4 children. Charles, Anne, Andrew and Edward.



Queen Elizabeth enjoyed spending time with her many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

At her coronation she became the head of the Church of England, and she often spoke about the importance of her faith.



"For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life.

A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance and healing.

Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people, of whatever faith or none."
