Year 6 Songwriting with Glockenspiels - L4 During Level 4 year 6 pupils will take a look at the music industry and what happens when a song has been written. Pupils will be given a brief at the beginning of the course to write a single for their new EP. Pupils will be taught what an EP is, be asked to create a band name, name their song, think of a theme for their EP and song and learn about press releases. Alongside creating their brand pupils will learn about key points of the music industry.	Singing L4 The focus will be on pupils'stage etiquette, singing as a group, the roles within a choir and singing in parts. This will be the first time the pupils will be singing in harmony. Pupils will practise singing in parts together and singing out of parts to get them used to listening to others whilst focusing on their own melody line. This is a very hard skill but with practice can be achieved.	Music Theory with Keyboards - L4 Pupils will further understand how music can be notated to represent pitch and rhythm. Pupils will understand how to read more complex rhythmic ideas and will be able to play music from stave notation within a range of C - C with confidence. Pupils will know the key features of both classical and jazz genres and understand how music has evolved across time.	Ukuleles - L2 This course builds on the pupils existing knowledge of ukuleles and encourages them to become confident and rounded performers. The pupils will recall how to read tablature and will learn how to read this across all four strings of the ukulele. The pupils will learn a wider range of chords in order to expand their performance repertoire. This course will also introduce pupils to scales and more complex playing techniques.	African Drums L1 Three standard playing techniques are introduced through playing 'Call and Response' rhythms with the workshop leader, who increases the difficulty as the class progresses. Groups will focus on advanced performance elements that will enhance their playing such as dynamics and tempo and put these into practice to perform complex polyrhythms. Performers' dexterity and playing stamina will also improve through regular solo performances.	Pupils will learn more advanced drum techniques and will be able to aurally recognise the difference between different drumming styles. They will understand how to read stave notation, in order to play popular drumbeats, as well as compose their own by utilizing different techniques such as rudiments and semiquavers. They will understand the relationship between the hi-hat pedal and the other parts of the drums, as well as confidently play through a final
