Introducing pupils to Christian values through their own actions and the actions of others. Start children on their journey of choosing who will inspire and influence them.	-Discussing all the different ways in which we celebrate the birthdays of people of all agesIf possible arrange the visit of a baby to your classroom and/or a collection of baby itemsTalk about the ways in which the children will be celebrating ChristmasTell and retell the story of the nativity several times using different storytelling techniquesClearly emphasise that Christmas is a celebration of the birth of JesusLook at the ways in which the local church is going to celebrate Christmas.
