
Brilliant Behaviour Recognition Board



We expect all children to start the day on ready to learn by being on time, being in the correct uniform and following our 4 B's.



Children who consistently follow our 4 B's, work hard and shine from the inside out by showing our Christian values will move into 'Time to shine' and will earn a values point. Values points winners will be awarded on Fridays in celebration worship. Parents will be informed on Wednesdays.



Children who choose not to follow our 4 B's will be given two warnings. If they continue to not follow the rules or are involved in a serious incident, they will complete a 'time to think' pink reflection sheet in their break or lunch time. Once they have reflected on their behaviour they will move back into 'Be ready'. Parents may be informed if it is a significant incident or we see a pattern of behaviour.


A typical day in Year 2

- 8.45- Handwriting/times tables/spelling
- 9.00- Register and morning task
- 9.15- Worship
- 9.35- Maths
- 10.30-10.45-Break time
- 10.50-English
- 11.45- Phonics (for the first half-term) then Guided Reading for the remainder of the year. However, some children may still access phonics as part of an intervention.
- 12.15-Dinner Time
- 1.15- Register
- 1.20- Session 1 (e.g. Art, Science, Geography, History, PE etc..)
- 2.20- Session 2 (e.g. Art, Science, Geography, History, PE etc..)
- 3.10/3.15- Story and prayer.
- 3.20-3.25- End of school day.

Phonics

We start Year 2 by recapping the more complex Phase 5 sounds for both reading and spelling purposes. Many of these graphemes were not included in the phonics screening check and are more difficult to grasp.













Children will have the opportunity to change their banded books twice a week on a Monday and Wednesday.


The children will be introduced their new spelling string on a <u>Wednesday</u> and the spellings related to this spelling string will also be sent home. They will focus on this spelling string for a whole week both in school and at home ready to be quizzed the following <u>Wednesday</u>. Above is an example of a weekly spelling list that will come home with the children every <u>Wednesday</u>. The final word will not be linked to the spelling string but it will be a common exception word that the children need to be able to spell by the end of Year 2.

Golden Time



For the last session on a Friday, we have golden time in class. This is a time when children are allowed to use all of the areas freely. For instance, they are allowed to build something of their choice with the lego, magnets and straws or make and colour something of their choice in the creative area.

In order to get all of their golden time, children need to have completed all of their work that week. They also need to have read a minimum of three times a week (checked Wednesday-Wednesday). If the children need to read or complete unfinished work, they will receive the remainder of their golden time once they have done this.





By the end of Year Two, children are expected to recall their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. It also helpful for them to learn their 3s and 4s times tables.
