If they continue to not follow the rules or are involved in a serious incident, they will complete a 'time to think' pink reflection sheet in their break or lunch time. Once they have reflected on their behaviour they will move back into 'Be ready'. Parents may be informed if it is a significant incident or we see a pattern of behaviour.








If your child is struggling to find time to complete their maths homework, they will have the opportunity to do so during Golden Time on Friday.
