




Brilliant Behaviour Recognition Board



We expect all children to start the day on ready to learn by being on time, being in the correct uniform and following our 4 B's.



Children who consistently follow our 4 B's, work hard and shine from the inside out by showing our Christian values will move into 'Time to shine' and will earn a values point. Values points winners will be awarded on Fridays in celebration worship. Parents will be informed on Wednesdays.



Children who choose not to follow our 4 B's will be given two warnings. If they continue to not follow the rules or are involved in a serious incident, they will complete a 'time to think' pink reflection sheet in their break or lunch time. Once they have reflected on their behaviour they will move back into 'Be ready'. Parents may be informed if it is a significant incident or we see a pattern of behaviour.

Homework

Reading

Please encourage your child to read little and often, ideally each day but at least three times a
week. Please also ensure that this is recorded in the children's reading record. The children's
reading diaries will be checked once or twice a week. When the children are ready to change
their book they are encouraged to write their name on our book change poster on the classroom
door. If your child is struggling to find time to read 3 times, they will have the opportunity to do so
on a Monday break time or during Golden Time.

Spellings


The children will be given their new spellings on a Friday and the spelling focus will be taught
throughout the following week in preparation for their test on Thursday. These must be practised
at home in their home spelling books. It is important to keep up with the weekly spellings as we will
be expecting to see them spelt correctly in the children's written work.

<u>Times tables</u>

• The children will really benefit from practising these regularly at home. They're invaluable in accessing many areas of maths as it frees up the children's working memory in order to access more challenging concepts. A common trend that we see in school is that children who have trouble recalling number facts often find maths challenging as a subject. As a school, we believe that everyone can do maths and that achieving fluency in number facts, rather than just accuracy, is essential to breaking down barriers. 

NumberSenseMaths

In KS2, we have a shared approach to the teaching of times tables and we run a daily intervention that involves chanting times table facts. Fluency helps children to enjoy more success in maths as it can help to free up a child's working memory and tackle more challenging concepts.



These are the 36 essential facts.

10, 11 and 12 times tables are taught in a lighter touch way due to patterns in the numbers and being able to use known facts to arrive at an answer.

Any support at home with times tables would be extremely beneficial to the children's progress in maths.



There will be a times table check in <u>June 2025</u>. This has been made statutory by the government for all Year 4 pupils. The test will consist of 25 questions. The children will be given 6 seconds per question. For more information, please see the following link:

CLOTHING AND KIT LIST

The kit listed below is what we suggest for participants to bring for activity days at the Anderton Centre. Any items marked with * are available to borrow from the Anderton Centre, if you are unable to bring any other items please let a member of staff know.

Day visits: (dependent on time of year)

- Warm old clothing (tracksuit/jogging bottoms or walking trousers are ideal; don't recommend jeans)
- Waterproof top and bottoms*
- · Warm fleece type jacket*
- · Hat and gloves (dependant on time of year)
- Sunhat and sun cream (dependant on time of year)
- Mosquito repellent*
- Strong shoes / boots
- · Complete change of clothing
- Any personal medication e.g. inhalers

Additional kit for water activities:

- Swimming costume / shorts and t-shirt
- Towel
- Spare jumper for getting wet (fleece if possible)
- Pumps or old trainers you don't mind getting wet (NO open toe shoes)
- · Plastic bags for wet clothing
- Warm and dry change of clothes including spare dry pair of shoes/trainers

Additional kit for residential programmes:

- 3 complete changes of clothes (depending on length of stay)
- · Spare underwear
- Indoor shoes
- Toiletries Aerosol sprays are not allowed to be used at the Anderton Centre.
- Towe
- Nightwear
- · Hand Held Torch with new batteries !!

Free drinking water is readily available - all visitors will need a water bottle/drinks for the day

Tuck Shop (for residentials only)

We have a tuck shop for crisps, drinks and sweets priced at around £1 per item. We leave it up to the Group Leader's discretion if they wish to advise young people and children to bring snack money for the day or keep it a cash-free trip.
