Please can all parents/carers ensure that the school reading records are signed, dated and page numbers added, so that when following up in class, we know where the children are up to. Reading books can be changed when the children have completed their books and they will be reminded in class to complete the book change sheet on a daily basis. We aim to check records 2-3 times a week to ensure consistency. Spellings will continue to be given out on a Monday. These can be revised by completing the spelling log at home, alongside the input in class that we do every day to ensure understanding of spelling patterns etc. We will also be setting a weekly spelling quiz on Purple Mash. If you misplace spellings, please see our class dojo page as these will be posted at the beginning of each new week. Please encourage your child to practise their times tables regularly on TTRockstars. We will also be setting a weekly times tables task on Purple Mash. Our PE days for this half term will be on a Tuesday and a Friday. All children should come to school in full PE kit on these days. Hair which is past shoulder length must always be tied up and jewellery is not worn in school either.
