English

Key Vocabulary

Non-chronological report, formal language, paragraphs, heading and subheadings, coordinating and subordinating conjunctions, edit, final draft.

Key Learning

Non-chronological Report

- · Plan and write a structured report
- · Use formal language and present tense
- · Organise information into paragraphs
- · Make use of headings and subheadings
- · Write in the third person
- · Make use of fact boxes or bullet point lists
- · Use full stops, capital letters, finger spaces, exclamation marks and commas for lists

Religious Education (RE)

Key Learning

Children will to begin to understand how the Bible and the stories it contains influences the way Christians lead their lives.

The focus is on the importance of the Bible and its teachings to people of the Christian faith and the impact it has on their beliefs and practices. Children will engage in activities that will allow them to begin to understand why Jesus told stories in his teaching and why they are important to believers, and to think for themselves about questions to do with stories and why some are sacred and important in religion.

Children are encouraged to consider what can be learned from the stories that Jesus told and how they affect people's beliefs, with examples and teaching referring to their own experiences, beliefs and values.

Science

During this module the class will be learning all about genre. They will be able to identify different genres throughout different 6mes in history, and some will be able to give key characteristics from those genres. Pupils will also be able to use filter functions correctly to obtain specific samples. Some pupils, by the end of the course, will be able to mix samples from different genres with success.

Music
