Understanding the World

Key Vocabulary

- Naming the season of Summer and looking at the features: understand changes in the natural world including seasons
- Children to find out about Africa: contrasting environment, similarities and differences between life in this country and other countries
- Looking at a map when on our educational visit
- Making a map of our outside area (pirates): describe their immediate environment using maps
- Muddy Monday: difference between Jack keys reservoir and the main road: describe their immediate environment)
- The Beach (Know about materials used to build a sandcastle, understand how to measure length properly, learn more about the beach environment and how to protect it)
- Space (Know what is in Space, learn the names of some planets and features of Space, know how Space travel is made possible)
- Planting and drawing pictures of plants
