


Rainforest visit

Years 3 and 4 had a fantastic trip to Tropical World in Roundhay. Whilst we were there, we took part in a workshop in the morning. This allowed us to explore the layers of the Amazon and what animals may live there. We also looked at animal



skulls to predict what we thought they might be. In the afternoon, we explored what it is like in a rainforest biome and saw



animals such as a crocodile, snakes and different types of monkeys.




Helping Ukraine


Chicks and ducklings
