



# Our Curriculum: Autumn term review 2021/22






It is lovely having everybody's smiling faces back to school since September, We have less children having to isolate now and have some 'normality' back in our lives! It is lovely to have the school full again!

We also enjoyed some workshops during our special week. We took part in African dance sessions, African drumming workshops and enjoyed playing steel pan drums.






# A visit from Parliament...

# Scooters






## Virtual temple tour

# Homework






Children across school have started getting different homework projects linked to their wider curriculum topics. How amazing are these Titanic structres that some Year 5 children made at home?
