

## **Musical Implementation Statement.**

At St. Bartholomew's, our pupils will be taught that music is a universal language which allows people to show the highest levels of creativity. They will be inspired to learn through high quality musical tuition, delivered by confident and knowledgeable staff, in turn developing the pupil's love of music, talent as musicians, confidence and sense of achievement.

By using the Charanga musical scheme, the children will be exposed to a wide variety of musical styles and genres. It develops children's ability to sing, play, compose and learn with confidence. The scheme also encourages children's learning to develop in a structured and logical pathway.

Throughout the school, children will be taught how to play and compose with a variety of instruments. By using a range of instruments in the classrooms, music will be all inclusive to all children. Throughout KS1, children will develop their playing and singing, using percussion instruments and glockenspiels. This learning will continue through KS2, where the recorder is introduced. By upper KS2, children will be able to pick which instrument they play and compose with, allowing the children to develop how they want to progress as musicians and encouraging children to develop their own musical talents. As many of our children will not be supported in learning music at home, it is the intent of St Bartholomew's to give children as many musical opportunities as possible, allowing them to create their own musical learning journey.

As well as music planned in the curriculum, the school also offers many other musical experiences. These include trips to see live music, opportunities to perform in concerts with other schools, choirs, clubs and Rocksteady, where children can learn music in a rock band scenario.
