REMINDERS

- <u>SCHOOL STREETS</u> the restrictions on driving up Strawberry Lane between 8.15-9am and 3-3.45pm are still in force. Weekly Round Up

Nursery – This week we have continued our topic of autumn. The children used repeated phrases to retell the story of 'Owl Babies'. We have been learning some facts about Owls. The children have used descriptive language to describe autumn items (conker, pine cone, leaf, stick, acorn). In Maths we have explored 2D shapes. In phonics we have learnt two songs 'If you happy and you know it' and 'Mrs Brown has a box' and the children listened to various sounds and guessed what they are. We have also made marks as part of our 'write dance' activity.

Reception – This week in Reception we have continued learning the story 'The three Little Pigs' using our story map. We have talked about the different characters in the story and described the big bad wolf. We have also been thinking about where we live and have worked really hard to draw maps from our houses to school. We have talked about the things we see on our journey to school including the Church, the Mosque and the field. In Maths we have been learning that 2 and 3 are made up of smaller amounts. We have used conkers pine cones and other natural materials to show 2 and 3 and develop our understanding of amounts.

Year 1 & 2- This week the children in Year 1 have been enjoying their RE lessons. They have been learning how we can all look after our world and that we can all play our part in making our planet a better place. Children came up with their own ideas about what they could do to make the world a happy and safe place. In Year 2, in RE the children have been learning about making good choices. They have looked at the Buddhist story called 'Taming the Angry Elephant' and how the Buddha showed love and kindness in the story. Using their oracy skills the children enjoyed discussing how they show love and kindness to others.

Year 3 & 4 –This week, Year 3 have been busy writing their own non-fiction texts! We've been exploring Anglo-Saxon weapons and learning how to use headings, subheadings, and captions to make our writing clear and engaging. In Music, we've been strumming along on the ukulele and learning some new notes. In Maths, we've started adding numbers using columns, and in PE we've been developing different football skills — teamwork, control, and accuracy.

This week, Year 4 have been working hard on column addition in Maths, sharpening their accuracy and confidence with larger numbers. In English, we've been identifying subordinate conjunctions and practising how to swap their order within sentences to improve our writing. In RE, we explored the different features found in a church and discussed their significance. In Science, we carried out an exciting experiment to investigate whether the strength of vibrations affects the sound produced, a fun and fascinating hands-on activity!

Year 5 & 6 – Lessons: In History, we recapped everything in our 'Activism' topic. In Science, we looked how the Earth, Sun and Moon are related to each other. In English, we have enjoyed writing the last paragraph of the 'Titanic flashback'.
