## Re-opening school

## We are opening for all children on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September.

We expect all children to return on this day. Please call school if your child will not be attending. The school will be following all normal attendance procedures from September including first day contact, home visits and referrals to other services and possible fines for holidays.

This has been a very worrying time and if you have any questions about your child returning to school please call us to discuss this. **Children returning to education is vital**. We will be putting all the recommended protective measures in place (see below) and will have a rigorous risk assessment that we will publish on our website once it is finalised.

#### Beginning and end of the day

We have had to ensure that we make these times of day as safe as possible and have staggered some year groups. We have also altered the entrances for some children. There will be staff outside every day to help.

Please make sure you bring your children and pick them up on time. Please leave the school grounds as soon as you can and do not meet in the playgrounds or at the entrances to school. Only one parent per family is to bring the children to school.

#### Parents in school

We will be only allowing parents in school by appointment or at allocated times to pay by card at the office. If you would like to speak to someone, please call, email the school, or see a member of the senior leadership team who will be around at the entrances at the beginning and end of the day.

Card payments for school lunches, breakfast and after school club can be made at the office on a Monday between 7am and 9am.

# <u>Lunches</u>

We have made the decision that under the current circumstances, we cannot use the dinning corridor for school meals and children will eat in their classroom.

From September, children who have a school meal will receive a grab bag; this includes a daily hot option. We will publish the menus on the website from next week. This is due to the continued restrictions in the school kitchen.

Children will be able to bring a packed lunch again. This must be in a labelled bag. We do not allow chocolate, sweets or fizzy drinks. Over the next year, we will be reviewing our pack lunch policy and will seek parental views on this.

If you want to buy a school dinner for your child, the cost will be £10 per week, you **must** pay for meals on a Monday. This can be in a labelled envelope and given to your child to take to class or can be paid for by card at the office between 7am and 9am on a Monday.

# Please note your child must have their meal choice for a full week and changes cannot be made on a daily basis.

## **Protective Measures**

St Bart's will be following the national and local guidance and is making adaptations where necessary. This will mean a different way of operating (a new normal). Children and parents who have been in school over the summer term will find most of the measures familiar and we will help those returning for the first time with them.

Essential measures include:

- a requirement that people who are ill stay at home and report this to school
- robust hand and respiratory hygiene (children will regularly wash/sanitise their hands throughout the day)
- enhanced cleaning arrangements including throughout the day
- active engagement with NHS Test and Trace(school will support parents with this)

consideration of how to reduce contacts and maximise distancing between those in school wherever possible, and minimise potential for contamination so far as is reasonably practicable.

How contacts are reduced will (as much as possible) include:

- grouping children together in class bubbles throughout the day
- avoiding contact between groups including at breaks and lunchtimes
- arranging classrooms with forward facing desks where appropriate
- staff maintaining distance from pupils and other staff as much as possible

# **Behaviour Expectations**

From the 7<sup>th</sup> September we will be returning to our normal rewards systems where possible, however we are not allowed for the foreseeable future to hold assemblies. We will expect all children to follow the school rules. There will be additional expectations around the safety measures we have put in place and a copy of the updated behaviour policy will be on our website for September. We expect parents to support school with these to help us maintain the safety of all children, families and staff.

## Social Distancing

In school where possible we will be following social distancing guidelines especially amongst staff and the children. We would also ask that out of school families continue to follow the rules and expectations, including the use of face masks on public transport and in shops (from the 24<sup>th</sup> July).

## <u>Uniform</u>

All children will need to be in school uniform from the beginning of term. The advice is normal washing routines are followed and clothes washed after a day in school.

## <u>PE kits</u>

Due to the continued restrictions, we are not able to let the children change for PE. Our proposal is that the younger children (Nursery, Reception, Years 1 and 2) can do PE in their normal uniform and the older children come in their PE kit on the day they have PE. We ask that all children come to school in suitable footwear as we hope to include more physical activity into the timetable where possible.

#### Personal belongings in school

We want to reduce the number of personal items brought into school and therefore ask that children do not bring any stationary, pencil cases or toys. Only those older children who come to school by themselves can bring a phone and these must be turned off in school and handed to their class teacher.

#### **Medical information**

If your child needs an inhaler or any other regular medication in school, please make sure they have it on the first day. In September we will update the records of children with a known medical condition; you will receive a call from the office regarding this. If your child has a newly diagnosed condition please let us know.

## After School Club/Breakfast Club

We have very limited numbers of places from September and they have all been allocated. If you want your child to go on the waiting list please contact the office. If you no longer need the place please let us know as soon as possible so we can allocate it to someone on the waiting list.
