By law we should have two current up to date contact details for every child, this is for safeguarding and to ensure we can contact you in an emergency. We appreciate your cooperation with this.

PSHE Lessons

After half term, in our PSHE lessons, we will be discussing the NSPCC's Underwear Rule. This is designed to teach pupils how to stay safe from abuse without giving explicit information or telling scary stories. In the lesson, children will learn about the 'PANTS' acrostic, which stands for:

- Privates are private
- Always remember your body belongs to you
- No means no
- Talk about secrets that upset you
- Speak up, someone can help
