Year Group Updates

Nursery: We are really proud of all the Nursery children, they have all settled well and are exploring all the provision. We have been reading the book Goodbye Summer, Hello Autumn and talking about all the changes that are happening- the leaves falling from the trees and changing colours, less sunshine and more clouds and rain and puddles to jump in. Please can you collect leaves, conkers and acorns when you are out and about so that we can use them in Nursery for painting with, counting, rolling and looking at with the magnifying glasses. A reminder for photographs of your child either as a baby or with their family for us to talk about and display. As Autumn is upon us please send your child with a coat as we still play out even when it is cold, thank you.

Year 1: This week in Year 1 the children have enjoyed reading our new book, funny bones. The children have been learning about the characters and have written some super sentences in English. In Maths we have had a great time learning about ordinal numbers. We set up a bus station and practised getting on and off it in the correct order. **Reminder:** Please can all children come to school with a coat now the weather is getting colder.

<u>Year 2:</u> This week we have started learning about instructions in English. We have enjoyed practicing following different sets of instructions, including a set of instructions that helped us to make our own jam sandwich! In Computing we are learning about emails. We have talked about what the @ key is for and how this is used in emails and have written our first email to Samuel Pepys.

<u>Year 3</u>: Year 3 have been comparing the stories of Little Red and Little Red Riding Hood in literacy and writing their own version of the stories. In maths we are learning about column addition and using counters to help us understand this. In design technology we have been designing our own Roman house, looking at Roman architecture for inspiration and planning how we will make our houses strong enough to support a roof.

Year 4: This week, year 4 have been reading and writing biographies about Charles Dickins. In Science, we have been experimenting with sounds. During French lessons, we have been learning different adjectives to describe different body parts.

<u>Year 5</u>: This week in Year 5, we have been designing our final tags in art, using all the techniques we have learnt over the last few weeks. In English, we have written a flashback in character about how it felt to board the Titanic. In Geography, we have continued to use our enquiry skills to find out about the USA.

<u>Year 6: Lessons</u>: In English, children have enjoyed writing about how to stay healthy. In History, children have looked at events leading up to World War 2 and also how Adolf Hitler rose to power. In Maths, children have worked hard on multiplying numbers.
