#### Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** - We have had another marvellous week in Nursery. Thank you to the children who brought in leaves, conkers etc but please can we have some more! I will be out acorn and conker hunting this weekend and due to all the wind we have been having the conkers are falling off the trees and just waiting to be collected. We have had a week concentrating on shapes and colours and played many 'finding' games both inside and out. The children have loved finding shapes that have been hidden and spotting them all around them- square and rectangle windows, circle wheels and triangular pizza slices. We have been practicing our gross motor skills- balancing, running, hopping, climbing, rolling and stopping. The new climbing frame with slide allows the children to try different ways to move along the logs and ways of challenging themselves to reach the slide. The grass surface we have now is great for practicing our rolling skills- Julia is a whizz at rolling around the playground.

**Reception-** This week in Reception we have been reading Superworm and creating a story map to recall the story using actions. In Maths we have been comparing amounts and identifying which group has more and which group has less. We have also been thinking about Doctors and how doctors may help us. We have been pretending to be a Doctor in our role play and giving our friends check-ups to see if they are well.

**Year 1** - This week in Maths, we have been partitioning numbers using the whole part model. The children have shown a great understanding. In History, we have been learning about toys in the past and comparing them to the toys we play with now. The children really enjoyed discussing their favourite toys with their friends in class.

**Year 2-** This week we are looking forward to making the fire engines we have designed in Design Technology. In Mathematics, we are practicing counting forwards and backwards in twos to twenty. We would like you to help us practice this at home, so we can improve our counting skills! In English we have enjoyed making and eating pizza this week in our unit on instructions. At the end of the week we will use all the skills we have learnt to write our own set of instructions about how to make a pizza.

**Year 3**- Have been reading a non-fiction book about wolves. They have been learning about the glossary and will be writing their own with the information they have learnt. In maths we are learning column subtraction using counters to help us. In Design Technology we have started constructing our Roman houses. We used a net to build the pediment and are working out ways to join our columns to it.

**Year 4** - This week we have been learning about some diseases in the Victorian era, such as Cholera. We investigated how this changed lives of the population, especially in Leeds. In maths lessons, we have started some work on addition using a column method. During our music lessons, we have been playing instruments alongside a famous song by a band called Abba. We have enjoyed creating biographies for a second week, following on from feedback we received last week.

**Year 5** - This week, the children have written their final flash backs about the sinking of the Titanic, the children have created some fantastic pieces of work! In history, they have been working in pairs to create a fact file about the Titanic using the I-Pads. The children have drawn some masterpieces in art this week, using the skills they have learnt of the last few weeks to produce a perspective drawing.

## Year 6 News

**Lessons:** In RE, children have enjoyed learning about the five Ks of Sikhism. In History, children have ordered and discussed key events of World War 2. In Maths, children completed work on short division. Next week, children will be completing work on long division.
