When we have to send children home, it affects parents and often results in you having time off work and it is only a decision we make after consultation and when it is for the safety of your children and the staff. However, I am aware of how difficult this is and we will try to support families and children as much as we can. I would also like to thank the staff who have worked hard to support the children and myself in these very unusual and difficult times. Unfortunately, this is likely to happen again and we will continue to work to keep our school safe.

Play-scheme

Some parents have asked what will happen if we have sent your children home to isolate with their classes. If you booked a place and still need play-scheme in October half term, the children are still welcome to attend as their 14 days isolation will be over. Please let us know as soon as possible if you would like to cancel their place. If you did not book a place for your children and have had to take unexpected time off work for this isolation period, we do have a few places available to book due to cancellations. Weekly Round Up

Reception – This week we have been comparing things by weight. We have also enjoyed continuing with our story 'Superworm' and have added to our storymap. We have also been learning about Autumn.

Year 1 - This week in Year 1 the children have enjoyed some exciting Science lessons. We have been learning all about our bodies and our senses. The children enjoyed learning about their 5 senses through different fun activities. We went on a listening walk, tasted different foods and smelt different objects. The children did a great job of recording their findings. In Maths we have been learning to use the tens frame to make number doubles to 10. The children showed a good understanding and loved playing teachers and using the giant tens frame in class.

Year 2 - This week we are practising counting forwards and backwards in twos, fives and tens in Maths. In Science, we are learning about the human life cycle. We are going to carry out an experiment to find out whether the size of our head changes as we get older. In R.E, we are continuing to learn about Jesus this half term, finding out how Jesus asks us to be generous and how we can do this. We will enjoy reading the story of The Good Samaritan in the bible as part of this work. Please help us practise our counting at home!

Year 3 - Year 3 have continued their topic of wolves in literacy and are now applying non-fiction features such as a contents page, captions and headings to create an information text. In maths we are applying our knowledge of column subtraction to missing number and word problems. In design technology we have finished our roman houses and in geography we are looking into volcanoes, how and why they erupt and the consequences of this.

Year 4 - This week, Year 4 have been looking at the features of a play script in English. We are building up our skills to write our own play script about Oliver Twist. In maths, we have been using counters to help us learn a new method to subtract larger numbers. In art lessons, we have enjoyed mixing colours to create paintings in the style of L.S. Lowry. We also looked at how the British Empire grew in the Victorian era.

Year 5 - This week we took part in a live assembly to discuss the importance of keeping ourselves safe online. We then made a poster with all the things we can do to keep ourselves and other safe. In English, we have been writing a newspaper report about the sinking of the Titanic, we had to use our research skills to find out all the important facts for our newspaper reports.

Year 6- Lessons: In RE, children have enjoyed different Sikh artefacts. Next week, children will be going on a virtual tour of a Gurdwara Temple. In English, children have started writing their own evacuee story. In Maths, children have enjoyed the challenge of completing long division sums.
