# **URGENT**

### Weekly Round Up

**Nursery** – We are loving exploring the properties of the windy weather. We have made wind streamers and kites as well as watching the different materials blowing on our washing lines and also catching the materials once they have blown of the lines!!

After half term our topic is The Dark, we will talk about how the evenings are darker earlier, about do we sleep in the dark or whether we have a nightlight and about the animals that sleep during the day and come out to play at night!

Please can we have more acorns and conkers and a reminder that the children need to bring a coat to school as we do enjoy being outside whatever the weather. Also thank you to the parents that have sent in their children's baby or family pictures and could I remind the others to send them in, thank you.

**Year 1** - The staff in Year 1 would like to say a big well done to all of the children in classes 3, 4 and 5 for settling in so well this half term. They have done a fantastic job and all the adults in year 1 are very proud of them!

This week the children have enjoyed learning about their 5 senses. We have learned and performed a senses poem and had a great time carrying out different senses experiments in Science.

**Year 2** – In year 2 this week we have celebrated black history month. We have been looking at the life of Ruby Bridges and we have discussed why she was so brave, we also discussed times when we have been brave. In DT this week we finished making our model fire engines, they looked fantastic and had all the important things that a fire engine needs. In history, we re-capped the story of the great fire of London and we wrote a newspaper report explaining what happened.

**Year 3** – We have been learning about the Roman emperor Septimius Severus from Roman times for black history week. We researched his life by looking at artefacts, statues and buildings. We also made Roman coins out of clay and gold powder in his honour. In English year 3 have read revolting rhymes and are writing their own for Halloween focusing on rhyming words and exciting language.

**Year 4** - This week, we have been spending the week looking at the lives of black people in history. In our science lessons, we looked at the first black astronauts in space and what this was like at the time. We have also used our knowledge of the famous artist, L S Lowry, to create a famous protest scene in his unique style. Well done on a great first half term and enjoy your break next week!

**Year 5** – We have been learning about the Atlantic Slave Trade. We have looked at how and where this began and who profited from this horrible trade. We have used primary sources to investigate what life was like for a slave. We then found out about how the slave trade was eventually abolished in the UK and the USA. We have created some fantastic pieces of writing this week and will be uploading a selection onto the website for you to see.

### Year 6 - Lessons

In RE, children enjoyed their virtual tour of a Gurdwara Temple. In English, children completed their own evacuee story. In Maths, children enjoyed investigating factors and finding common factors. Children have also looked at the impact Jesse Owens, John Carlos, Tommie Smith and Colin Kaepernick have had on sport around the world.
