The children and staff have settled back into a routine at school and I hope you have too after all the disruption. It is lovely to see the classrooms full again.

It is vital all children come to school and are on time to start their learning with their class. However, if you are running late for any reason please contact school and bring your child in as soon as you can, they must not miss the full day.

If your child or anyone in your house has symptoms, you must book a test for that person and you must all isolate. If the test result comes back negative you can all finish isolating and if well enough return to school. If positive, you will need to continue isolating for 10 days.

IT IS VITAL THAT CHILDREN DO NOT COME TO SCHOOL IF THEY HAVE OR LIVE WITH ANYONE WHO HAS SYMPTOMS OR WHO IS POSITIVE.

If your child needs to isolate due to COVID we will provide work, if you need support with computers during this time we can help. Just ask.

We can also order a food hamper from Leeds Catering if your child receives benefits related free school meals.

the children care for the books and bring them to school every day, as they will also read in class. Please start using book bags again to keep them safe.

Online Safety



In school we teach the children about the dangers that can happen on line and as the children get older we talk about how they use social media. However, we cannot monitor or restrict their use of social media Apps and online games they access at home. We have had some concerns raised about what some of the older children are doing on these, some causing offence to other children. As parents, we are the ones who need to check what our children are doing online and ensure they access age appropriate Apps, most social media Apps are age restricted and primary school children should not be using them.

Weekly Round-Up

Nursery- Oh, we have had fun on the high seas this week! The weather has been super for the last couple of days so lots of hiding and finding lost treasures and making treasure maps for our friends to find the 'the X that marks the spot'. We have also hatched a dinosaur egg that has been very exciting. We all wondered what type of dinosaur we would hatch, the children all made their choices, and the winners were the ones who said 'T- Rex'. Photos of our adventures will be on the website. We are starting to plant some flowers around Nursery as spring is here, donations of plants and cuttings greatly appreciated to create our colourful oasis, thanks. Stay safe.

Reception- This week we have been carrying on with our topic of In the Garden, and we have been focusing on Bees. We have read stories and learnt lots of facts about them. This week in Maths we have been practicing making repeating patterns in lots of different ways, including printing with paint. We have also been talking about recycling and how we do it to look after our planet. We have enjoyed playing games and sorting out rubbish into the correct recycle bin.

Year 1- This week we have been continuing to look at traditional tales. We have been reading different stories and enjoying practising our story map for 'The Three Little Pigs.' The children did a great job of asking the wolf different questions and learning how to use a question mark. In Maths we have been learning to count in 2s and enjoyed making a 2s caterpillar. In Science we have been learning about plants and their functions.

Reminder: Please can children remember to bring their new homework books back to school each week to practise their words in class.

Year 2- This week we have continued our work on multiplication. We have begun to look at the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. You can practice this at home with us, starting with 10 then 5 and 2 times tables. In Geography we have learnt about ariel views and created a plan view of our classroom using this skill. In Science we have begun to look at different food groups by practising sorting food in different ways.

Year 3 – We have been reading the Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe, focusing on the vocabulary used and how it impacts the story and creates images in the children's minds. They have also been designing their own worlds through the wardrobe. In Maths we have been focusing on measurement using mm, cm and m, converting between these before adding and subtracting to answer problems. In Science we have been focusing on light and shade, using mirrors to reflect light and learning the good and bad things about the sun as well as learning how to protect ourselves from the sun.

Year 4- This week we have been comparing a fiction and non-fiction text in English. In Maths, we have been building upon our work on decimals and looking at how we can divide these by 10, 100 and 1000. In Geography, we have been having a debate about deforestation. We enjoyed starting our dreamcatchers in art.

Year 5- This week we have written a balanced argument on the use of single use plastic, we have tried really hard to add all the key features and you will be able to see some examples of these on the Year 5 area on the school website. We have continued our topic on Vikings and investigated why the majority of Vikings who came to Britain wanted to settle and not invade. We have been recapping over division and multiplication in maths.

Year 6- In RE, children investigated the different Stations of the Cross. In English, children have enjoyed writing an eye witness account of being in a tsunami. In Maths, children have recapped over addition, subtraction, multiplication and division of decimals. In Geography, children designed their own tourist leaflet for Leeds.
